## 4. Clean Slate Botanicals

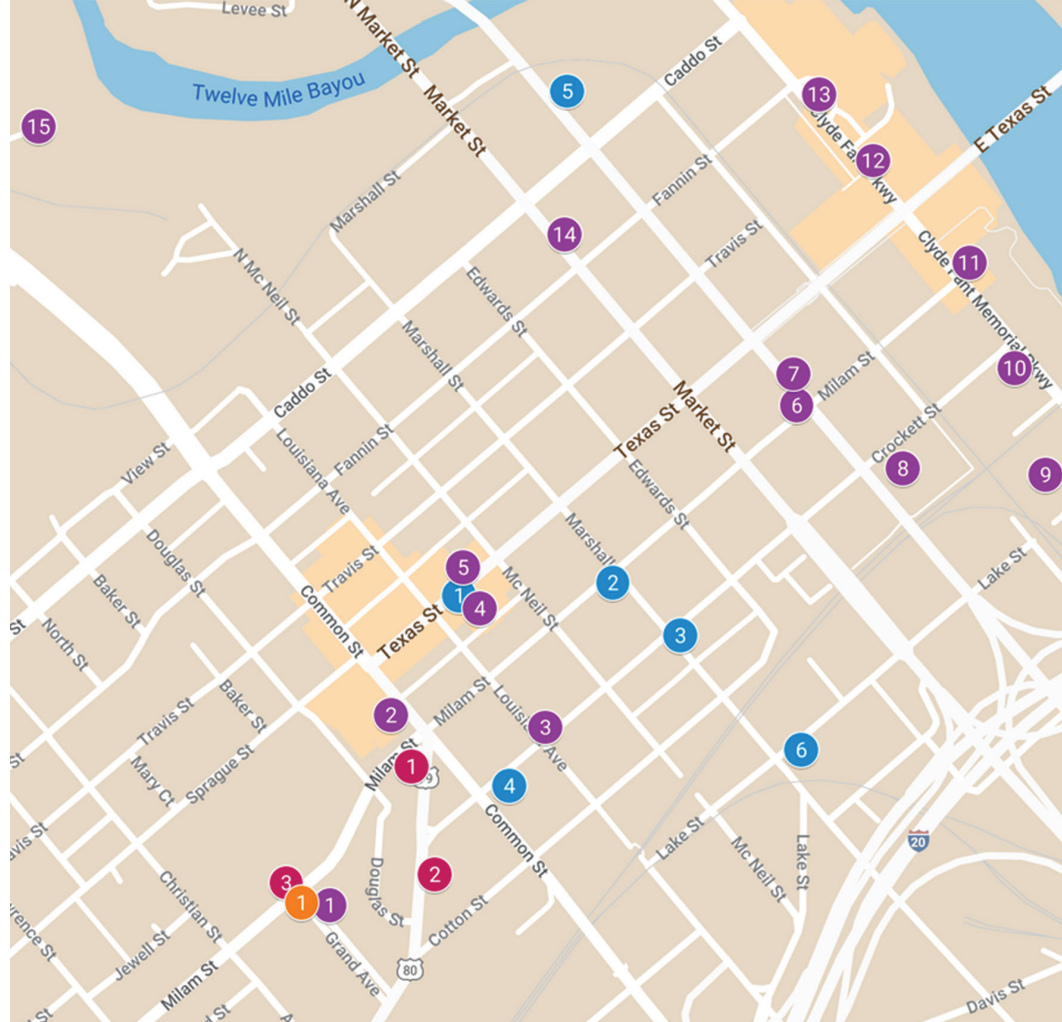
717 Crockett Street. Mon-Sat. Bath & body products made from locally sourced plant-based ingredients

705 Elvis Presley Ave. Historic venue where Elvis Presley first took the stage. National touring acts, family shows, comedy & more

## 2. Emmett Hook Center Theater

550 Common St. Located at First Methodist Church, theater hosting concerts, theater, worship, lectures & seminars.

## 3. The Strand Theatre of Shreveport

619 Louisiana Ave. Built in 1923, this architectural beauty plays host to touring Broadway productions, concerts & plays.

## 4. Robinson Film Center

617 Texas St. Tue-Sun. Indie films, popular cinema, special events & screening. Abby Singer's Bistro.

## 5. Southern University Museum of Art

610 Texas St. Featuring works, artifacts & treasures of Africans, African Americans & their descendants.

## 6. Multicultural Center of the South

520 Spring St. Tue-Fri. Educational center dedicated to the history & diverse cultures of Northwest & other parts of Louisiana.

## 7. Spring Street Historical Museum

525 N. Spring St. Tue-Sat. 1866 former bank housing a large variety of historical & vintage artifacts from Shreveport. Lectures and revolving exhibits.

## 8. Festival Plaza

101 Crockett St. Outdoor venue near the riverfront featuring Shreveport Farmers' Market, Mudbug Madness, Red River Revel, Brew and more.

## 9. Sci-Port Discovery Center

820 Clyde Fant Parkway. Wed-Sun. Explore & engage in math, science & technology. IMAX, planetarium, 200 plus exhibits, special events.

## 10. J. Bennett Johnston Waterway

**Regional Visitor Center.** 700 Clyde Fant Parkway. Tue-Sat. Exhibits about the Red River past and present. Audiovisual, static and interactive exhibits.

## 11. Shreveport Aquarium

601 Clyde Fant Parkway. Mon-Sun. Touch tanks, feedings & experiences, Treasure Mine search, gardens & special events.

## 12. Bally's Shreveport Casino & Hotel

451 Clyde Fant Parkway. Mon-Sun. Casino, many restaurant options, live entertainment.

## 13. Sam's Town Casino & Hotel

315 Clyde Fant Parkway. Casino, many restaurant options, live entertainment.

## 14. Remington Garage

211 Market St. An extension of the Remington Suite Hotel & Spa hosting live performances, private & corporate events.

## 15. Shreveport Water Works Museum & Railroad Museum

142 N. Common St. Tue-Sat. The last steam-powered municipal water treatment plant in the United States. A National Historic Landmark.

# PARKS

**1. Asian Gardens** 800 Texas Ave. Garden and sculptures representing 15 different countries.

## 2. Caddo Common Park

869 Texas Ave. Downtown's newest green space, Caddo Common Park plays host to art exhibits, poetry readings, concerts & events.

**3. Oakland Cemetery** 1000 Milam St. The City's oldest cemetery & resting place of Shreveport's pioneers for over 150 years. National Register of Historic Places. Yellow Fever memorial.
